### ***ADOPT A REVOLUTIONARY MOTTO FOR YOUR LIFE***

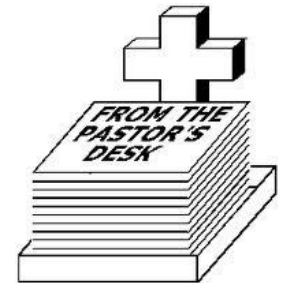

# ALZHEIMER'S FUND RAISER



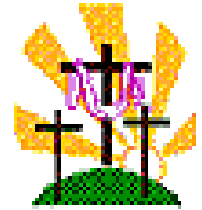

**Greeter:** Arrive at 10 AM; assist worshipers with the doors; welcome all as they arrive.

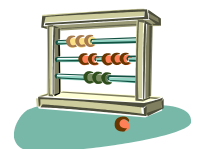
