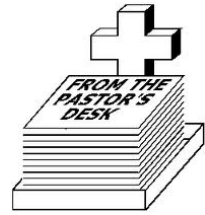

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



It is the Collier family's twelfth day of vacation and we have traveled from Iowa to California, and then up the coast to Washington state. I am writing from Puget Sound. As we have traveled, we have seen so much incredible beauty, and such amazing people. However, my heart is still in Iowa...I don't need to tell you that things for farmers are looking tough. Some people are flooded; where or when does it stop?

While stopping at an outside restaurant on the ocean we ran into a couple that was angry. Let me explain. We were about to be seated at a nice pizza place with a deck overlooking the ocean. Thousands of people had come to this area in Tacoma Bay to play in the water (the city fountain, not the ocean because it's too cold to swim here), ride bikes, scooters, or skateboards, and walk with dogs and family. It is Memorial Day and there are lines everywhere, even for the ice cream. We have waited/played for almost an hour to get a table. At that point, they sent a text to my phone saying our table was ready. As we went in to get our glorious spot in the shade, outside, overlooking the people and the ocean, I overheard someone say, "This will never do!". Without playing out each scene, I will tell you they were upset because one beautiful family had a cute little dog with them on the patio. The manager was called and moved the family to the rail where the dog was to stay outside the rail. In spite of the special accommodations, the 'grump' still decided, after waiting an hour for a table, that they would leave. Let me tell you we were there for almost 2 hours and enjoyed every minute!

This morning my heart is heavy for all those who are discontent. Here the weather is incredible, but people live on top of each other and wish for open spaces. At home, the weather has been tough, but we drive without congestion. I was drawn to this scripture in my reading this morning.

1 Thessalonians 5:9-10: "For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us so that whether we are awake or asleep we might live with him."

Our hope in Jesus is in the relationship that transcends every discomfort and disappointment. It is Christ who even conquers death. My prayer is that you will enjoy life from the advantage point of a Christian whether you are asleep or awake!

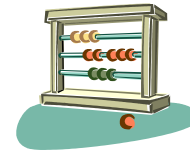

PARISH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS



Highlights from the May 13 Parish Council meeting: **Youth Group:** The Youth Group is sponsoring two students from Thailand as a special mission project
Pastor's Report: He has scheduled weekly volleyball games in Ainsworth instead of bachelor lunches. **Mission Committee Special Report** – Ann Freyenberger told the council about the program, “*Building Bridges Out of Poverty*”. The goal is to empower as opposed to enable persons experiencing poverty. She is working bring the program to Washington County. Once established, the program strives to work with groups of 12 adults for 16 weeks and provides transportation, child care, meal, and monetary incentive for participation. The program has had excellent results in other communities of similar size in Iowa. The ultimate goal is to help the entire family (including educating the children) to get out of poverty and stop the cycle. **Christian Education:** Colthurst Scholarship recipients were selected: Carson Bean, Gracyn Bean-Humston, Joey Collier, and Erin Mills. Camperships are available. **Membership/Nurture** – Cards have been sent to those with health concerns. **Worship** –High School seniors were presented teen version Application Study Bibles: Carson Bean, Gracyn Bean-Humston, and Brady Hahn were in attendance. Trey Lasek, Kaitlyn Schultz, Kylie Wood, and Mitchel Byerly will be given their Bibles at a later time. Others in the Ainsworth area who are graduating will receive cards of congratulations from the church. Gift certificates from Dairy Mart are being purchased for Mother’s Day and Father’s Day. Worship in the Park will be on Father’s Day, June 16. Pulpit Supply in the near future: May 19: Parnell Davis; May 26: Ilene Schnicker; June 2 and 9: Scott Johnson. **Property** – We have a new family living in the parsonage – John and MarieAnne Ward with their daughters, Shirley – 7 and LilyAnne – 6. Future repairs needed on church property: Gravel in the alley between churches, termite inspection, steps at North Church are crumbling from all the salt this winter, gutter issues at South building, exterior doors at both buildings, trim tree in north yard of South church, repair bench and move them outside. Joe Skubal has agreed to give leadership to the group. **Mission** – In April the Mission Committee food pantry served 13 families for a total of 41 people. **Nominating:** We are losing our two youth representatives on the Parish Council as they graduate from high school in May. It was agreed to extend an invitation to the following youth to fill this vacancy – there is no problem if they all accept: Dalton Diers, Shalyn Kirk, Lexi Collier. **Old Business:** Checks from insurance claims at parsonage are ready to deposit. Buzz is making sure the yard is being mowed. Wilson's repaired drains. **New Business:** Apportionments: Following discussion, it was agreed to pay \$1000 of our apportionments to each denomination at this time. Jason will be at Annual Conference during the time of the stated June meeting. It was agreed to hold June 17 as a date if there is need for a meeting or to conduct business by email. There is no meeting in July.
