
SENIOR SUNDAY - MAY 7

GRIEF SUPPORT GROUP





PARISH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

An overview of reports and issues discussed at the March meeting



Treasurer's Report: Items of note: 1) Jason was reimbursed for bathroom and iPad expenses; 2) Painting labor for Fellowship Hall paid; 3) Paid Linda McNeil for painting supplies; 4) received more rent money; still behind, but making positive progress; 6) Furnace repairs were paid; 7) More renovation expenses were paid. **Worship**: Supervised completion of painting the

interior of the Fellowship Hall. Still need volunteers to greet at each door on Sunday mornings. Also need a few more snack volunteers. Plans are to have Senior Sunday on May 7. Colthurst Scholarship applications are due by 5 PM, Sunday, April 23. Jan will contact Tom Colthurst about presenting on Sunday, May 7. Christian Education: Kids' Club has concluded for Spring session on March 1. About 12 youth were participating each week. On Ash Wednesday, there was a pancake supper prior to Services for all Kids' Club families and the Ainsworth/Crawfordsville community. Consensus was to continue partnering with UCC for Vacation Bible School. Jason indicated the van could transport youth from Ainsworth to Crawfordsville and back again. Membership/Nurture: Sent flowers for birthdays and get-well cards sent. **Property:** The restroom and coffee nook are almost complete, but usable. Still need to install a grab bar; Painting in the Fellowship Hall completed; Donation from Bob Quinn to be used for the South Church - doors have been earmarked - \$25,000. Furnaces - N&H recommended replacing all 3 furnaces at the South Church. Committee may contact N&H as well as 4-M for estimates to repair vs replace. Mission: - In January, the Mission Committee served 8 families representing 27 individuals. In February the pantry served 8 households representing 28 individuals. Nominating and Memorial Committee: No Report; SPPRC: A new janitor has been hired: Abigail Drost of Washington. Following discussion regarding salary in this economy, it was agreed to pay Abigail \$15 per hour. Approved. It was then agreed to increase secretary salary to \$15 per hour. Old Business: - Decision to replace toilets in the Fellowship Hall will be placed on Property Committee agenda. New Business: Agreed to replace TV broken during installation following renovation. Many thanks to Adam and Erin Kaufman for assisting with installation of the replacement. Two requests for baptism - 1) Maverick Jaxon Havel and 2) Rose Carstensen. Approved. Next steps: It was agreed to get copies of the deed from the courthouse and review for additional information. Jan will send Articles of Incorporation to Council. The date for a 2nd meeting will be Sunday, April 2 (Palm Sunday) following worship. **Next regular meeting:** Monday, April 10 at 7 PM.
