PARISH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS



Following are highlights from the September 18:

Finance: Nothing unusual. Committee Reports: Worship: As per requirements of the Presbytery that the Communion Schedule must be approved by the Council, a Quarterly schedule was approved: January, April, July, and October - the first Sunday of those months. Christian Education: Kids' Club kicked off on Wednesday, September 13 at Marr Park; about 25 adults and youth attended. This year, the time of Kids' Club will be 6 to 7 PM. Jason will be moving the TV from the loft of the North Church to the stage for use during Kids' Club. If that one isn't large enough, we may need to purchase a different one. We should consider a bulletin insert about Kids' Club to share with UCC. In the future, we may wish to consider alternating the location of Kids' Club with UCC by holding Fall Session at one church and Spring Session at the other. Membership/Nurture: Jan now has the entire membership book since 1973 (when the church became the Ainsworth Community Church) including Pastors, Elders, Members, Baptisms, Death, and Marriages in Excel format and saved on a thumb drive. Property: Insurance bid: Jason and Jan met with a representative from Brother's Mutual - they will be giving a bid on property insurance. Theatre Ministry: Jason met with Allan Allsup about equipment/supplies in the North Building. It was agreed to send a certified letter to Allan Allsup expressing thanks for his efforts to establish a Theatre Ministry within our community. However, we do not wish to accept responsibility or liability for his property and request him to remove all of his property from the North Church by December 1, 2023. ACC is willing to help him move. Erin will write the letter. Jason is seeking a mailing address. Mission: - In August the Mission Committee served 11 families representing18 individuals. Three freezers were defrosted and cleaned. SPPRC: They met August 29 to review the position announcement for the secretary vacancy and make plans. Kris and Jason are taking the lead on reviewing candidates. During the meeting they also reviewed Jason's salary and benefits for 2024. It was agreed to keep it the same as 2023. Nominating **Committee:** They will be working to present a report to be reviewed at the November Council



meeting. Old Business: New Members: During worship on August 20, 2023, 5 persons were welcomed to membership in the Ainsworth Community Church: Jason Anderson, Deborah Chalupa, Jennifer Crossett, Marshall Crossett, and JoAnn Torpey. Disaffiliation: Sunday, August 20, 2023 at 3:30 PM, 35 members of the Ainsworth Community Church (all over the age of 18) met to vote on disaffiliation from the United Methodist Church. There were 32 yes and 3 no votes to proceed

with disaffiliation. Motion carried. New Business: We received written notification from the UMC that to meet our requirements for disaffiliation, we must pay: Unfunded Pension Liability – \$6,494; Apportionments – \$9,668* Which is a total of \$16,162 by November 30, 2023. Following discussion, it was agreed to wait a little longer to pay this amount until more of the

paperwork is completed. Annual Meeting: The following schedule was agreeable to the Council for an ACC Annual Meeting where items such as 2024 budget, slate of committee members and Terms of assignment for Pastor Jason: December 3, 2023. The congregation will review the material on November 19 and 26 after Council reviews all on November 13. Goals:Next CONGREGATIONAL month, we may wish to set a date for a dinner meeting to set goals for 2024. Budget Plans: Colleen welcomes input from all the committees as to budget



requests they will have in 2024. She will need these by November 5. Doors: Following discussion, it was agreed that Jason will resume work to replace the exterior doors at the South Church. The next regular meeting will be held Monday, October 9 via Zoom.
