From the Pastor

Dear Church,

I am writing to you after our disaffiliation vote at both churches. They both voted to leave the UMC, and not much has changed. We are doing church as we have always done it! I want to be very clear about one thing. We did not vote for or against LGBTQ... We simply decided to leave the UMC because we felt it was right for us. Yes, the vote reason "needed" to be that we did not agree with the way the UMC is and has handled this particular issue. But please know that we love everyone God loves and that means YOU! I hope and pray that if you are struggling with this and want to hear my heart and what I believe to be our church's heart or if you need someone to listen, please call me. We are all going through something! And adding other stuff onto that is hard. We are not moving or changing much at all! We just want to be the best church we can be. That means loving people the best way we can. We need these difficult conversations to maintain relationships. Sometimes, my wife and I will say things that hurt the other without ever meaning to. And because we love and care for each other we go back and have a conversation where we are vulnerable and loving to each other. Rarely does it not get better immediately.

Several people have asked how I am, and or if I feel we made the right choice and I feel 95% we made the right choice. And I am proud of our churches. I am planning to be a pastor in the Presbyterian connection now. That will be different, but I am looking forward to it. I have been in fellowship with them for 10 years now as your pastor. So we (YOU AND I) are praying God will bless our church and bless His people through all of this. And that He will be glorified! FYI this is not official until November 30, 2023.

Parish Council Highlights



Following are highlights from the August 14 meeting: Finance: Bills outside normal monthly billings: Paid for camp fees for 2 youth to attend Crooked Creek Camp; Paid for a sound system computer (paid from Memorial); South Church water bill higher than normal due to running toilet that has now been repaired; Paid Parsonage renter a portion of her water bill for watering grass due to construction. Paid insurance; Paid legal fees for consultation concerning church property; Paid registration fee for one person to attend "Walk

to Emmaus." Balance sheet – July expenses more than income by \$2,513.41 but still ahead in income versus expenses. Update on Parsonage rent: Jo is extending the renter's deadline. Committee Reports: Christian Education: VBS was held August 1-4 with UCC in Crawfordsville. About 10 youth from ACC participated. Kids' Club will resume in September. Property: The railing by the North door of theSouth Church was painted and installed: An additional computer and keyboard were added to the South Church Sound booth in order to improve the ability to stream the service; Nick Yoder repaired the church office computer. Mission: - In June the Mission Committee served 9 families representing 28 individuals. In July the Mission committee served 11 families representing 36 people. Old Business: Disaffiliation: A letter was sent by June 30 to UMC indicating we wish to disaffiliate. Informational meeting was held with the new district superintendent in July. The UMC has now set August 20 at 3:30 PM as the date they will conduct our official vote to disaffiliate. New Business: Requests were received from the following to JOIN ACC: Jason Anderson, Deborah Chalupa, Marshall Crossett, Jennifer Crossett, and JoAnn Torpey All requests were granted. They will be presented to the congregation on Sunday, August 20, 2023. It was agreed that we will still need to have the same committees going forward as we have now as per our Bylaws. Jan will contact the nominating committee and make sure Colleen takes steps to prepare a budget. Jan is working to get everything ready for her retirement. She plans to forfeit her salary and begin training her replacement as soon as someone is identified. The goal would be to have them trained by the end of December 2023 so they are ready to go in January 2024. She will work with SPPRC. Following discussion, it was agreed she would suggest to them that the new secretary receive \$15/hour up to \$5000 per year. This is subject to adjustment as time goes forward. UCC may soon be adding a Christian Education position. Jason may approach us for partial reimbursement of his YouTube account. Next regular meeting: Monday, September 18, 2023, 7 PM via Zoom (note date change).
